1. This completed form.
2. Official transcripts of all college or university work to date. **Note:** *To be considered official, transcripts must arrive in sealed university envelopes with the registrar's seal/signature across the envelope's seal. Open or unsealed transcripts are not considered official.*
3. An official copy from the Education Testing Service of your scores on the aptitude sections of the Graduate Record Examination. (**GRE Codes: Institution Code-2074; Department Code-2299**)
4. Three letters of recommendation evaluating your potential for graduate study from persons who know you well, including at least two professors or employers. A Graduate Appraisal Form is included on the website with the application form and must be completed by your recommenders.
5. Include in a maximum of 2 pages an essay addressing the following questions: Why do you wish to do graduate work in the Department of Social and Decision Sciences? What attracts you to our doctoral program in particular? Describe your academic interests, including the type of research that you are interested in pursuing. What are your major career goals after completing your study at Carnegie Mellon University?
6. Submit a check or money order (bank draft for international applicants) for \$45 US dollars made payable to Carnegie Mellon University. The application fee must accompany your application. **NOTE:** We do not accept any other payment methods, including wire transfers, to cover the application fee. We will not waive the application fee..
7. If English is not your native language, you must have ETS send us an official report of the scores that you achieved on the TOEFL, Test of English as a Foreign Language. It is extremely important to use only these codes or we will not receive your TOEFL scores: **TOEFL Codes: Institution Code-2074; Department Code-92. NOTE: For the Internet-based TOEFL, the Department Code is 80.**
8. Your resume/vitae
9. (Optional) A sample of your writing.
